Security Deposit Packet

What is a Security Deposit?

A security deposit is an amount of money you pay to your landlord before you move into the rental unit. Your landlord keeps this money until the lease is finished. The money is held by the landlord during the term of your lease as "security" to make sure you do not break your lease or damage the rental unit.

Can I Get my Security Deposit Back?

When you leave the rental unit, you will be able to get your full security deposit back IF:

- You leave the unit in good condition; AND
- You are up to date on rent payments.

IF:

- You are behind in your rent; **OR**
- You have damaged the rental unit; **OR**
- You have not cleaned the rental unit; **OR**
- You have broken your lease

your landlord does not have to return the full amount of your security deposit.

BUT - Your landlord may keep only that part of the security deposit needed to pay for unpaid rent, repair damage you have caused, or clean your rental unit.

What Steps should I take to get my Security Deposit back?

- 1. **Give** your landlord **notice** that you are leaving;
- 2. Give your landlord a forwarding address; and
- 3. Clean the apartment; and
- 4. **Return** the keys to your landlord.

If I follow the steps, what does my Landlord have to do?

Within 30 days after the end of the lease AND the time you move out of the unit AND return the keys, your landlord MUST:

- 1. Return your full security deposit to you; **OR**
- 2. Return a portion of your security deposit AND tell you in writing exactly what the unreturned money was used for.



What Should I do if my Landlord does not return my security deposit after 30 days have passed?

If your landlord does not return your full security deposit you may:

SEND a Letter Demanding Your Security Deposit
 (See Sample: Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #1)

What Should I do if my Landlord does not return my FULL security deposit OR doesn't tell me in writing what the unreturned money was used for?

If your landlord does not return your full security deposit OR does not tell you in writing what the unreturned money was used for you may:

SEND a Letter Demanding your full security deposit OR that your landlord tell you, in writing, what the unreturned money was used for.
 (See Sample: Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #2)

What Should I do if my Landlord does not return any portion of my security deposit OR I disagree with what the landlord kept my security deposit for?

If your landlord does not return your full security deposit you may:

1. **FILE** a Complaint in Small Claims Court.

- 2. Put your landlord's name and address here

- 7. Put the day you moved out here
- 8. Put the amount of the security deposit you wish returned here
- 9. Put the address where you want the security deposit sent here
- 10. Sign your name here

SEND the letter to your landlord by **CERTIFIED MAIL** and request a return receipt **KEEP** a copy of the letter **AND** the **RECEIPT** showing the letter was delivered to your landlord

Instructions: Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #2

ONLY Use this Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #2 **IF** your landlord sent you some money back but not all of it without you ever sending a letter **OR** responded to your first letter **BUT**:

- 1. Your landlord did not send a full refund; OR
- 2. Your landlord did not tell you in writing what the unreturned money was used for; OR
- 3. You disagree with the amount returned to you.

USE the SAMPLE Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #2

as a guide to help you fill in the blank form that follows:

- 1. Put the date here
- 2. Put your landlord's name and address here
- 3. Put your landlord's name here
- 4. Put the address of the rental unit you moved from here
- 5. Put the amount of the security deposit you paid when you moved in, here
- 6. Put the last day of your lease here
- 7. Put the day you moved out here
- 8. Put the date you sent your first demand letter here (Only keep this sentence if you sent Letter Demanding Return of Security Deposit #1. If you didn't, cross this sentence out.)
- 9. Put the date you received the amount returned by your landlord here
- 10. Put the amount of the security deposit that was returned to you here
- 11. Put the number of items from your landlords list of damages here. If your landlord gave you a list, keep this sentence. If your landlord did not give you a list, remove this sentence
- 12. List the deductions here. If your landlord gave you a list, keep this sentence. If your landlord did not give you a list, remove this sentence
- 13. Put the remaining amount of the security deposit you wish returned here
- 14. Put the date you want the remaining amount returned (2 weeks from the date you mail the second letter would be reasonable)
- 15. Put 2x the remaining amount of your security deposit here
- 16. Sign your name here
- 17. Put the address where the security deposit should be returned here.

MAKE a COPY of the letter

SEND the letter to your landlord by **CERTIFIED MAIL** and request a return receipt; **KEEP** a copy of the letter **AND** the **RECEIPT** showing the letter was delivered to your landlord.
